Pupils' Rules and Regulations

1. It is prohibited for every pupil of the Najude Pioneer School to fight with a fellow pupil inside the class rooms, on the school compound and on the way coming to school. It is also prohibited to steal things, be it from fellow pupils or from teachers, personal or school property. It is not allowed to use abusive words against a fellow pupil or one of the teachers. No form of violence, be it physical or verbal, will be tolerated.
2. All the pupils shall come to school punctually, also and especially during dry season. Every morning, all of them shall be in the school at 07:00, in order to sweep their class rooms and the school compound. The Primary School pupils also have to brush their teeth before assembly. After break, they shall return to their respective class rooms immediately after the ringing of the bell, where they will wait quietly for their teacher to come back. The big break ends at 10:35, and the small break ends at 12:25 precisely. Late coming in all these cases will not be tolerated. During school hours, the pupils are not allowed to leave the school compound except with permission of their class teacher.
3. It is not accepted to be absent from school, unless there is a sound reason such as sickness or death of relatives. No excuse will be accepted, however, if the parents of the pupil concerned are not informed that their child has been absent from school. No pupil shall therefore leave home and go somewhere else and then come back home in the afternoon, pretending that he or she went to school.
4. Physical Education is compulsory for all the pupils in every class, boys and girls. All of them shall take part in the exercises and games, according to their capability and strength. It is very vital for their health and well-being to exercise their bodies. P.E. is an important part of the syllabus of the Najude Pioneer School. No pupil shall refuse to take part in these lessons or go home during P.E.
5. No pupil shall leave school before closing hour, which is 14:45 from Monday to Thursday and 12:00 on Friday.
6. No child is allowed to enter the school premises with any dangerous object that may hurts or injures somebody.
7. In Primary School classes 1 to 3, the language in which lessons are conducted is Hausa, and the pupils learn how to read and write in Hausa. However, for the pupils in Primary School classes 4 to 6 and in Secondary School, it is compulsory to use the English language only during the school hours, in the classrooms as well as on the school compound. For them, the Hausa language is strictly prohibited unless during Hausa lessons or when the teacher allows them to use their mother tongue. This rule serves the aim of improving the oral English skills

of the pupils. Nobody shall feel ashamed to speak English, even if he or she is having a strong accent or is making mistakes. No pupil shall ever laugh at a fellow pupil who is trying to speak English.

8. The pupils shall be obedient to their teachers, and give them the respect they deserve.
9. The prefects shall be respected by the other pupils. The prefects themselves shall fulfill their respective duties with efficiency and seriousness. They shall be an example for the other pupils in whatever they do or say.
10. The pupils shall respect and tolerate each other, regardless which tribe or religion they belong to. All of them shall treat each other friendly and with decency and try not to exclude each other. The pupils of the Najude Pioneer School shall be one big family.
11. Every pupil shall come to school with his or her writing materials and with a broom. Every pupil has to take part in the sweeping of the school compound and the class rooms every morning. After this, Primary School pupils shall brush their teeth before assembly.
12. All pupils shall appear clean and tidy and with a perfectly neat uniform. Their uniforms have to be washed, and they must wear the correct stockings and sandals. Torn uniforms, socks and stockings are not acceptable. In order to pass the daily morning inspection, the pupils have to be washed, their hair combed, their nails cut and their teeth brushed.
13. During the lessons, the pupils shall keep quiet and they shall not play. They shall pay attention to what their teacher is explaining to them. They shall not talk, unless the teacher tells them to. They shall try their best in order to learn fast and efficiently, so that they will pass their respective classes successfully and complete their Primary and Secondary School education with as much gain as possible.
14. The pupils shall always do all the homework given to them. At home, they shall revise the topics they learned at school, and they shall go on with reading their books as often as possible. They shall also try to help each other and to learn together, which is more effective than to do study alone.
15. The pupils shall treat the school books with much care, because other pupils will use them after them. They shall not spoil any school property. Also, they shall be careful with their own school material.
16. In case of disobedience of any of the rules stated in this document, the pupil concerned will be punished. According to the offence that he or she committed, it could be a physical punishment, delaying after school hours, charging of a fee or anything else that the class teacher or the Principal may decide to do. This punishment will be carried out by the class teacher or the discipline master. In case of repetition of the offence, the parents will be informed about the situation, and that they should advise their child to do better. The first warning will be oral, the second and last warning will be in written. If there is no improvement after this, or if the pupil concerned carries on with his offending behavior, the pupil will be expelled. After this, there will be no possibility for the pupil concerned to return to the Najude Pioneer School.
